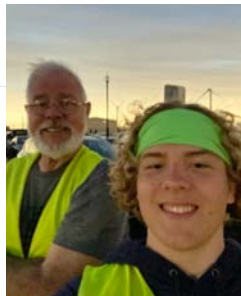

Solar Eclipse 2024

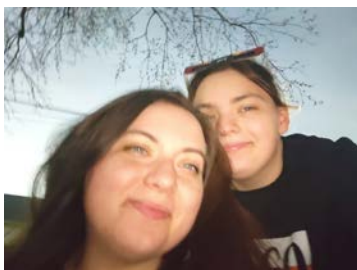

Honor Symposium

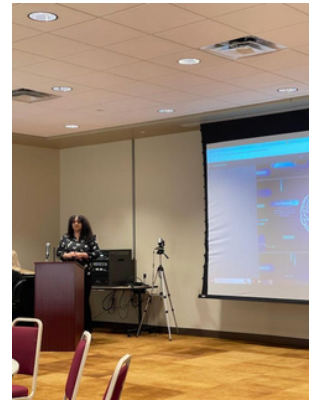
May 3, 2024
