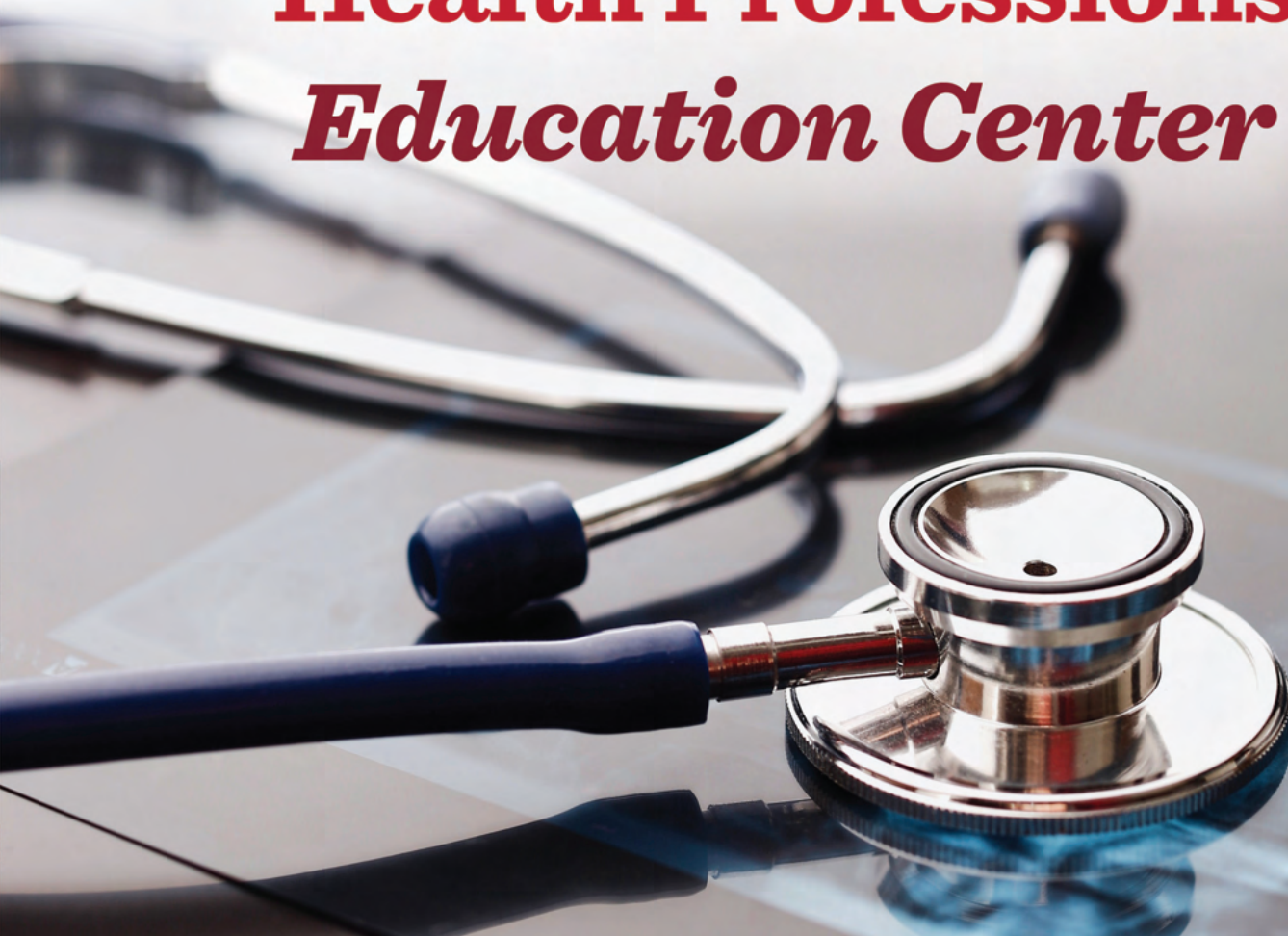

Owens Community College began educating nurses in 1970 and continues to meet the community's demand for healthcare professionals today. The college's School of Nursing and Health Professions has established a high-quality reputation of educating healthcare professionals who are in demand and work in northwest Ohio and beyond. Nearly 13,000 nursing and allied health professionals have graduated or started their education at Owens and gone on to successful careers.

More healthcare workers are needed, with the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) indicating healthcare is the fastest-growing industry and expected to add the most jobs by 2033. The American Hospital Association reported nearly 100,000 registered nurses left the workforce in a two-year period through 2023 and a staggering 610,000 reported an intent to leave by 2027. This shortage of healthcare workers is evident in northwest Ohio where in Fall 2023 there were 1,200 vacant RN positions alone.

To infuse the northwest Ohio market, the Owens Community College Foundation is embarking on a campaign to raise funds to help increase the number of healthcare graduates whose education is strengthened with the latest technology. ❤️

RENOVATED SPACE

The renovated Health Education Center will feature more than 86,500 of square footage, providing students with both renovated and newly constructed space including state of the art simulation areas to practice interprofessional education and training.

- ✔ Surgical

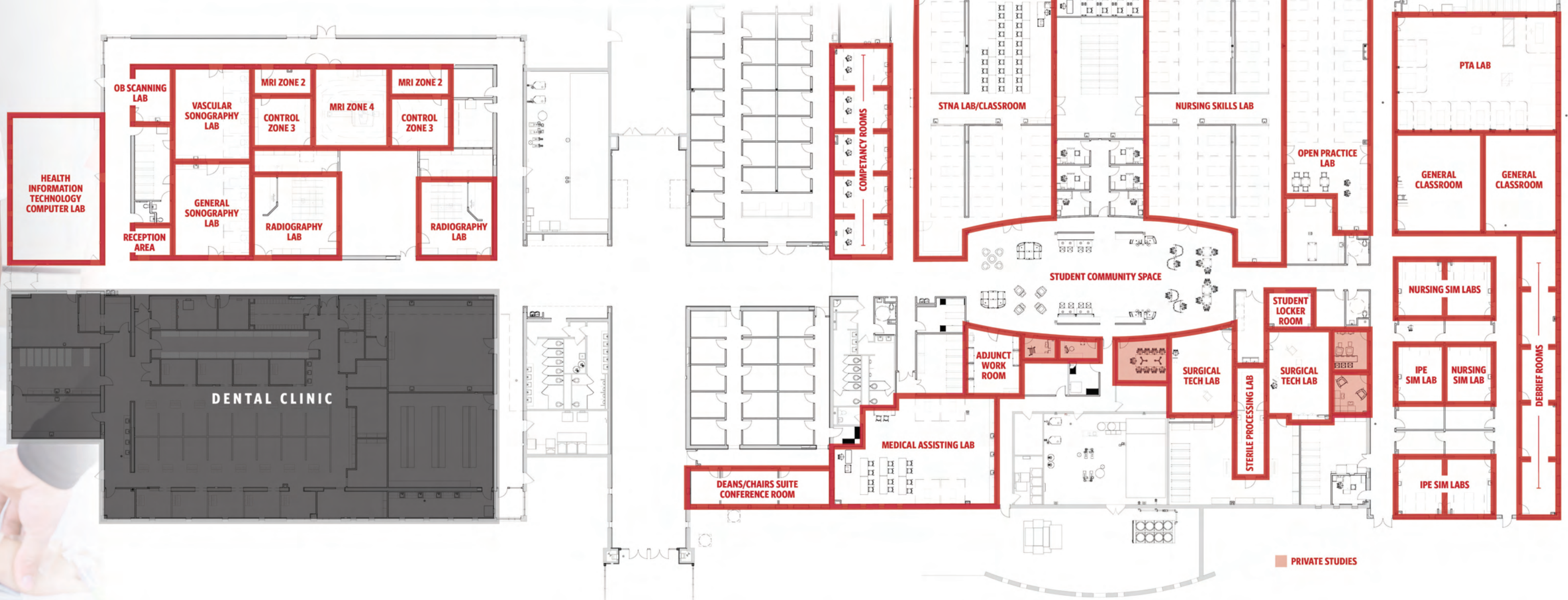
Owens Community College is excited to support labor demands across the region by providing highly-skilled healthcare professionals from a new nursing and health professions education center.

The \$31.3 million center will be located on the east side of the Toledo-area Campus in the buildings formerly known as the Library and Audio/Visual Classroom Center.

The School of Nursing and Health Professions will relocate from three existing buildings into the new education center and continue to fulfill Owens' approach of interprofessional education (IPE), where healthcare graduates are well-trained to practice collaboratively and provide patient-centered care to members of the community.
